


















































Our preferences and profile

Main focus/theme of DILABS

Literacy – functional literacy

- → reading and writing competences relevant to our main direct target groups
- → literacy related to working tasks and participating in society.



















Target groups

 immigrants with low or lack of language competence in general

unemployed people

 people who need to de/recontextualize or develop their literacy to better match literacy demands in society and workplaces.



















Overall perspective

- Combining reading and writing

 literacy
- Functional literacy social practices of literacy
- Explicit learning strategies to literacy themes
- Students' and trainers' books correspond to each other thematic.
- E-book and paper version: same structure same content



















Aims - courses

1. Develop courses or training programs for adult learners.

More specific:

Different and relevant study themes in reading and writing aims to increase adult learners' literacy competence, by for instance clear instructions and self-studying tasks.



















Aims - courses

2. Develop training courses for trainers/teachers

More specific:

Focusing themes and learning strategies or methods easily adapted to trainers / teachers relevant to adult learners.



















Aims - material

3. Develop material to the content of these courses or programs such as study book(s) for learners and handbook for trainers / teachers; both in paper version and as digital e-learning study program.

More specific:

Study book for learners and handbook(?) for trainers / teachers containing different themes, learning outcomes, learning strategies / methods to each study theme.



















Intellectual output (6): Teacher's / Trainer's book

Themes

- Description of the theme (grammar / linguistics)
- Use and function in social and cultural contexts

Methods/learning strategies

- Example (of the specific theme) in context
- Explanations
- Exercises/activities: reading and writing
- Use in different contexts
- Learning outcome
- Evaluation

Themes

- Description of the theme (grammar/linguistics)
- Examples in different contexts (social – cultural)

Learning strategies

- Study examples
- Activities/exercies
- Good advices
